6:45 Summary of 2012 – Chris McGee

- Financially, we are doing well this year. We have less income than in 2011, but this was expected with and planned for in the 2012 budget. We have reduced the amount of money that passes through the organization (no longer collecting and paying insurance, no longer collecting all entry fees from KHMTT and paying expenses). We continue to invest in two main areas:
 1. Event presentation and race kit equipment (tents, tables, banners, wrap the trailer, stakes, and signage).
 2. Technology (laptops, wi-fi capability at events, registration support, and website improvement).
- Membership: 3,437 at Thanksgiving. In 2011 we ended with 3,367 members.
- Race Participation:
 1. Road: Approximately 23,000 racer days on the road (15,500 racer days on the road in 2011). Growth due to many mid week series, the inclusion of the collegiate events, and many big race days.
 2. Cross: The first two months averaged more than 1,000 racer days per week. (10,500 racer days in cross in 2011).
 3. Track: In our first year of supporting track racing in Colorado, we had 641 amateur racer days.

4. We are optimistic that the ACA will have 35,000 racer days in 2012 (road, cross & track) up from 26,000 in 2011. (Our total was 32,500 as of November 12.)
- The 2013 Road Calendar is very full, with racing from March 2 until September 26. We had a very good Road Promoters Meeting in October – thank you all!
 - Memorandum of Understanding signed with Rocky Mountain Collegiate Cycling Conference to define relationship and provide structure to our scheduling efforts – thank you Topher Hurley from RMCCC.
 - Change in our website to use USAC numbers as identifier. This will simplify the race registration data requirements. This will be accomplished by end of December, 2012.
 - BRAC Registration validation support – Upcoming training for race directors and race registrars. – thanks Clint.
 - USADA presence at up to 3 local events in 2013.
 - Women’s Initiatives for 2013 – Mentoring at Three Criteriums, a Saturday Women’s Camp, Twenty Minute Beginner Women’s races at two crits, greater communication between women’s team rides. Very successful Women’s Summit in November – thank you Rachel Scott and Susan Adamkovics!
 - 2012 Member Survey upcoming – thank you Carol Kauder!
 - Masters Category Committee – meeting January-June 2013 to solicit input on possible changes to what we offer for 2014
 - Insurance Endorsement for Officials on Motorcycles and in Automobiles at Road Events

Additional Information regarding the Motions Above

Information regarding Insurance for Officials in Motor Vehicles and Motorcycles

USAC offers an optional insurance endorsement to provide coverage in the event of an accident involving a official who is on a motorcycle or automobile during a race. The price is \$100 for the first 5 motorcycles (\$50 for each additional) and \$25 for officials in automobiles. This endorsement protects the official and the race director, and provides additional protection for the ACA and USAC. We became aware of the importance of this endorsement in the late spring of 2012, and after considerable research with insurance companies and other local associations, decided that this is an important endorsement to purchase. Starting in June, 2012, as part of assigning officials, the ACA coordinated the purchase of these endorsements and paid \$5,000 in insurance fees on behalf of our events for the remainder of the road season.

In 2013, the ACA will assign officials and coordinate the information flow for these endorsements as part of the assigning of officials. The ACA will coordinate and pay for this insurance endorsement for road events in 2013 as a service to our members and safe racing.

Motion regarding Timing System.

The ACA Timing and Results System works at a very high level technically. The read rates for chips are above 98\$. The current organizational model for the system, however, which uses member data as the identifying chip number, has proven to cause many problems at registration, scoring and results generation. The organization owns the hardware, cameras, and software. The membership currently owns and manages their timing chips. If this system is to work flawlessly, the management of the timing chips must be with the timing company. The current model of chip management must be changed for 2013.

Option A – Redeploy the system using the ‘Timing Company’ business model in which the numbers on the chips are coupled with bib numbers. This option will require the creation of a 1,500 chip pool that is owned by the organization, and goes to the races in the D&L Timing Trailer. Race Directors will be part of the process of distribution and collection of timing chips on race day. There will be no rental chip fee associated with this business model.

Option B - suspend use of the system indefinitely.

Motion regarding Branding of Organization

The legal name of organization is Bicycle Racing Association of Colorado (and has been since 1976). We have and use a ‘doing business as (dba)’ of ‘ACA’, which is the acronym of our former dba ‘American Cycling Association.’ At the 2011 Annual Meeting, it was decided to use the dba ‘ACA’ for 2012 to provide continuity in our branding from 2011 to 2012. After the first few months of 2012, it became apparent that this acronym is causing some confusion, especially among new athletes and clubs. We will retain the ‘ACA’ dba as part of our legal name (with the Colorado Secretary of State and our bank accounts). This motion only pertains to marketing purposes. The Board of Directors recommends

that this change be made for branding purposes. Should we stop using the acronym 'ACA' and use 'Bicycle Racing Association of Colorado' or 'BRAC'?

Elections for 2013-2014 Term

Board Members Running for Re-Election

Clint Bickmore – The current President of the Board of Directors, Clint holds a PhD in Metallurgical Engineering and is Vice President of OnMaterials, an environmental engineering firm that does remediation work around the country. He has been instrumental in the success of the Junior Development Program, and has served as Event Director for the Junior Camps. Clint has three boys who race road and cross, is a well-respected race director (Kick It, Schoolyard Cross), and holds a USAC Level 2 Coaching License. His volunteer work in 2012 has been instrumental in working through the data issues that were encountered with the inclusion of USAC data.

Tim Lynch - Tim is the current Vice President of the Board of Directors. Growing up in Fort Collins, he has always had a passion for cycling. That passion was cemented during his first year of college in Durango, CO. Following a weekend of CX racing in 2007, Tim had a heart attack at the age of 37. The experience forced Tim to re-evaluate and define what was truly important in his life. After 20+ years of riding/racing bikes, Tim chose to give back to the cycling community and was elected to the ACA board in December 2010. Continuing to give back and wanting to grow Northern Colorado cycling (and cycling in general) Tim promoted the "Cross of the North" cyclocross race in 2011, and is promoting this event as the 2012 Cross State Championships. Tim currently races for the E2 Cycling team and works for Northern Colorado Water Conservancy District to find cost effective water conservation solutions for the public. A father of 3 incredible daughters and husband of 20+ years, Tim credits his family for the accomplishments and successes in his life.

Lynn Taylor – Lynn has been on the Board for four years, and serves as the liaison between the Board of Directors and the Technical Committee. She has been involved with cycling for thirty years in the Midwest, California and Colorado. Schooling: BS (Genetics) from UC Berkeley, MS (Biochemistry and Molecular Biology) from Colorado State University. Day job: Senior research associate at CSU, Biochemistry and Molecular Biology. On-the-bike experience: San Jose Bicycle Club in high school/college; Grand Rapids Rapid Wheelmen (Michigan); total of 13 years racing experience. USAC Central Region BAR Champion (1982); Michigan State Women's Road Champ (1983). Years officiating: 26, last 6 including USAC Road/Track National Championships, NRC races, and UCI stage races. Have found my niche as a judge. USAC 2011 Mountain Region Official of the Year. Most memorable officiating experiences: volunteering in 1985 at the Steamboat Springs stage race and doing results completely by hand, including using a typewriter; 2007 Tour of Missouri, 2009 Amgen Tour of California, 2012 UCI Master Cyclocross World Championships, 2012 USA Pro Challenge.

I look forward to listening to BRAC community concerns and celebrations, acting as a liaison between the cycling community and the association, and serving in a leadership role for our association.
