2022 SCHEDULE OF FEES AND SURCHARGES

1.1 MEMBERSHIPS

A Colorado Cycling membership, for individuals or clubs, provides benefits not available to non-members (see Colorado Cycling General Policy Manual). Memberships end on December 31st.

1.1.1 Individual

Senior/Master Membership (>18)	\$ 40 per year
Official's Membership	\$ 30 per year
Junior Membership (18 and under)	\$ 20 per year
One-Day Membership	\$ 5 per day
(\$3 to Colorado Cycling, \$2 to event director)	

1.1.2 For racers participating in a Colorado Cycling competitive event with a USAC One-Day Beginner license, and for out-of-state riders, the Colorado Cycling one-day membership fee is waived.

1.1.3 Club Membership \$ 100 per year

2.1 COLORADO CYCLING OPERATIONAL SURCHARGES

Definition: An Operational Surcharge is a fee paid by all racers to support Colorado Cycling operational budget.

2.1.1 The operational surcharge is a pre rider / per day at all USAC competitive events in the area for which the Colorado Cycling serves as the Local Association of USAC. Fee is based on the Colorado Cycling Race Service Package that a race director chooses. There are two tiers (basic and premium) that come with different benefits as described in the General Policy.

2.2.2 Basic Package:

Road Races - \$0.75

Criteriums/Time Trials/Hill Climbs - \$1.25

Cyclocross/Track - \$0.75

2.2.3 Premier Package:

Road Races - \$1.75

Criteriums/Time Trials/Hill Climbs - \$1.75

Cyclocross - \$2.00

2.2.4 Weekday Events - \$1.00

2.2.5 Multiday Events – For multi day events, the fee will be the rate for the highest level event (i.e. the RR in a three-day omnium or stage race). All subsequent days will be half of that fee.

2.2.6 Operational surcharges are waived for collegiate riders competing in collegiate classes at events run under collegiate permit

2.2.7 Operational surcharges are due 21 days after Colorado Cycling sends the club the surcharge report. Surcharges not paid within 21 days will incur a \$100 late fee per week overdue.

3.1 USAC INSURANCE SURCHARGE

Definition: This insurance surcharge is set by USAC, and collected by all USAC clubs/Race Directors to pay for the insurance for racers on race day. The USAC surcharges are subject to change by USAC at any time. At the beginning of 2022, they were as follows

3.1.1 All Events

Standard Rate: \$5.05 per-rider / per-day

Discount Rate: \$4.85 per-rider / per-day. [Details Here](#)

3.1.2 Insurance surcharge price will either be \$200 minimum, or the per-rider fee, whichever is greater.

4.1 REGISTRATION AND RACE SUPPLIES

Supplies typically needed for registration purposes. Supplies are provided per one USAC event permit:

4.1.1 Colorado Cycling maintains a supply of race numbers. Clubs/Event Organizers that do not wish to acquire numbers themselves from other sources may get them at no cost from Colorado Cycling, subject to limitations. Numbers from Colorado Cycling may have Colorado Cycling sponsors on the title. Race numbers come as part of any premium package selected

4.1.2 Race Directors who purchase their own rider numbers must make sure that their numbers meet Colorado Cycling and USAC minimum standards as described in the General Policy. Race Directors who purchase their own rider numbers must make sure that their numbers meet Colorado Cycling minimum standards as described in the General Policy.

4.1.3 Colorado Cycling clubs/Event Organizers have full use of the Colorado Cycling race kit when they select the premium race service packages. However, any loss or damage to Colorado Cycling equipment will be charged back to the club/Event Organizer.

4.1.4 Colorado Cycling maintains a supply of course tape for staking cyclocross courses. Club/Event Organizers will be given 15 (1000') rolls for each day of racing when they select the premium service package. The course tape may have Colorado Cycling sponsors or Colorado Cycling logos on it. Additional rolls may be purchased.

5.1 OFFICIALS FEES

5.1.1 Minimum Fees

Race Category	Chief Referee	Chief Judge	Other
All Events*	Full Day: \$200 Half Day: \$120	Full Day: \$140 Half Day: \$100	Full Day: \$115 Half Day: \$ 70
* All Local Events, All National Calendar, National Championships, UCI races, and events with a \$5000 or greater prize list in any individual race.

- 5.1.2 The work day shall begin when the official arrives at the site or one hour before the first race, whichever is later, and will end at the time when the required work is completed.
- 5.1.3 Mileage to and from the official's home and during the race will determine what is to be charged. Race Director's shall also pay the maximum IRS business mileage rate to, during, and from the event and/or venue inspection. The current rate can be found at www.irs.gov.
- 5.1.4 The Race Director is responsible to provide housing and meals if an overnight stay is necessary before, during, or after the race.
- 5.1.5 The Race Director must provide a meal and liquid refreshments for officials who work more than five hours during an event day. If meal(s) are not provided, the Race Director shall pay an additional \$15.00. If officials have dietary restrictions that the Race Director cannot meet and/or chooses to bring their own food, then they will be paid \$10.00. For multiple day races, when an overnight stay is required, the race director shall pay each official a \$35 per diem.
- 5.1.6 A Chief Referee may charge a \$ 50.00 plus mileage for a site visit if the Chief Referee feels that such a visit is necessary. If an overnight stay is required, housing and a per diem of \$25 are required.
- 5.1.7 In case a race is canceled after officials have begun their travel, officials will receive a half-day fee and their mileage.
